Since 1967 I have been employed as Senior Scientific Officer in a small team based at the Sa Crop Research Institute, which is investigating problems of adaptation, disease resistance and utilization of primitive South American potatoes in the Northern Hemisphere (see, the instance, Carroll, C.P. (1982) A mass-selection method for the actimatization and improvement of edible cliploid potatoes in United Kingdom. J. Agric. Sci. Came. 99:631-640). Prior the entering this field of work I was employed as a cytologis at the Welsh Plant Breeding Station (1957 onwards) study reproductive processes in forage grasses from warm temper areas (see, for instance, Carroll, C.P. (1966) Autopolyploid and the assortment of chromosomes. Chromosoma, Beau. 18

I first came in contact with the distinguished philicand spiritual teacher, Bhagwan Shree Rajneesh, while travelling in India in 1976. He was at that time leading community in Poona, Maharashtra State, which beside primary purpose in the area of meditation and religious education was also concerned with creative crafts and cand the cultivation of a quite wide range of food plant I found a higher level of awareness than was usual i India of the problems of plant disease and the need to

match cultivars to environment and husbandry technique I was later able to arrange for seed. amples of various moultivars of tomato and bell-pepper to be sent to Poona where they were trialled for suitability in the ashram

gardens. Recently I had the opportunity of visiting th new community established by Bhagwan Shree Rayne in the State of Oregon, U.S.A. (City of Rajneeshpuram). The communal enterprise has been set-up in a remote and a area which has been reduced by poor range-manageme in the past to semi-desert, subject the to serious soil-en I was surprised to find that, in only two seasons of dovelopment, a productive muck-farm has been establis and that dainy cattle and winter wheat are being raise successfully. On the truck-farm a wide range of regeta cultivius are being tested for performance under local conditions. Scientifically planned irrigation and control ground-water are being practised. The ecological balance i in the area is being protected and restored through avoida of pollution, and composting and rocycling of waste. Althou Bhagwan Shree Rajneesh originally trained in philosophy an religion his understanding of modern society and its proble seems to be outstanding, and he has a rare ability to inspir large groups of people to care for, and improve, the envir -ment by a combination of hard work and the application up-to-date scientific knowledge. Rajneeshpuram is a uniq experiment, which could perhaps only have come about in the United States and which is of international relevance is the field of agricultural vernewal. It would seem to me to be a retrograde step if it had to be terminated because of administrative difficulties concerning a visa for this outstanding Indian national.
