I have degrees in Zoology (Hons B.Sc., University of Western Ontario) Wildlife Biology (M.Sc., University of Western Ontario), Ecology (Ph.D., Queen's University) and have professional certificate as an associate Wildlife Biologist with The Wildlife Society. I have taught for organizations such as the above universities, St Lawrence College, the Ontario Universities Program in Field Studies and the Huntsman Marine Laboratory.
