In my life I have had many varied work experiences. I began working at the age of sixteen - waitressing - and graduated from high school with high honors. Then I entered the art Institute in Kansas City on scholarship and supported myself by teaching Tai Chi Chuan which is a form of Chinese martial arts and a meditation dance form. I was a very promising art student.

I had many artist friends in New York and noticed that though they were becoming well known yet they did not seem very happy.

I went to Japan and worked as a conversational English instructor to businessmen and also as a proof reader for an international advertising agency called Standard Advertising.

Being near Bhagwan, seeing him drive by each day when I'm at 'the ranch' I just feel showered, literally filled with

love for the people around me. I am filled with awe and wonder that I am alive.
