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Dear Sir !

To whom it may concern !

When I first happened to read one of Bhagwan Shree Rajneesh's discourses on Tao, I was a university teacher of linguistics (M.A. lit.), married to a lawyer, had a nice flat, a car, enough money, in short: I lived in an easy and comfortable situation.

I read this discourse and something in me said: "Yes, yes, of course, yes, this is finally I had found what I had been looking for since I started using my mind as a teenager devouring books of all colors and ages, at the end of my teens trying out Christianity, planning to study theology in my first university year going into politics, during the beginning of my teaching career doing social work in

prison, and already married joining the human growth movement and doing all kinds of psychological groups and training as a therapist.

All these were interesting experiences but left me unfulfilled.

And then I read this discourse in the Rajneesh Newsletter. Suddenly my whole being was thrilled: I had found it! there was somebody who knew.

Today after nearly seven years with Bhagio I can say: He knows the unknown and the unknowable. He taught me, what no book, no university, no philosophy, no psychology, no religion could teach. He taught me to accept myself and others, to go with the flow of life instead of fighting it. To see the beauty and mystery of existence, he made me a consciously religious person.

At that time, in 1976, I could not put anything into words, I simply

knew I had to see this man. I quit my job, sold my belongings, left everything behind and travelled to India.

I came to the Ashram in 1976 and stayed till 1981 when Bhagwan left for America. I had the most amazing time of my life. What happened in Poona I can only describe as a total cleansing. Layer after layer of my social and psychological past were made conscious and disappeared listening to Bhagwan's daily discourses. I found a living gospel, not empty words, but someone who lived his message. I could open my heart and for the first time in my life trusted someone. In those five years with Bhagwan my life was transformed.

When I returned to Europe in 1981 I felt softer, younger, and

and stronger, more alive and mature  
more able to cope with life in any  
situation, not only in the dusty files  
of a university.

I did lots of jobs I had never learned  
and discovered my ability to make  
money. All this I regard as a result  
of Bhagwan's teachings to be in the  
world but not identified with it.

I am learning more and more the  
balance of the inner and the outer

I have been visiting Rajneesh  
puram twice, for the 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup>  
Annual World Celebration and I was  
amazed by the progress made. Such  
enormous efforts : all those new build-  
ings, the lake, the roads - to mention  
only the obvious.

But the most wonderful thing is to  
live - even only shortly - in a comu-

unity based on love without crimes or violence, where people respect and love each other and have a positive outlook on life.

It is amazing to stand in a queue where no one is pushing, bus-drivers crack jokes, and everybody is happy to be where he is, where work is not hard but worship and people enjoy what they are doing. All this goes far beyond any social-, group- or human growth experience.

It is an outstanding and never before tried experiment in communal life, only made possible by the presence of a living master, whose abilities of teaching go far beyond all normally recognised standards.
