During my stay in the United States two weeks ago, I was able to see a few T.V. talk shows in which a representative of the I.N.S. explained to the public why the I.N.S. denied a permanent visum to Bhagwan Shree Rajneesh. The absurdity of such a decision struck me so much that I cannot but react.

I myself have never been able to actually see Bhagwan talk 'live' since I only became a sannyasin some 2 years ago, after He went into silence.
