Since october 1980 I'm a disciple of Bhagwan Shree Rajneesh. In the course of these years I have realized the emminent philosophical importance of his teachings.

It would'nt be wise to follow the wide tradition of condemning and prosecuting philosophers who are concerned to free people from dogmatic systems.
